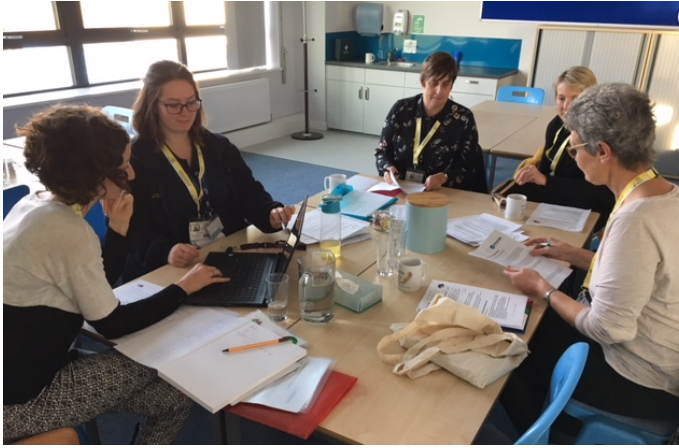


SEND: INCLUSION IN THE MAINSTREAM CLASSROOM

COURSE DESCRIPTION:
